DIRECTIONS

From Denver International Airport: Exit the airport on Pena Boulevard and go 10 miles to Interstate 70. Enter I-70 westbound and go approximately 80 miles to Exit 203 (Frisco/Breckenridge) CO-9. Continue 11 miles to Breckenridge, where CO-9 becomes Main Street. Go through town. Resort entrance on the right.

From Colorado Springs Airport: Exit the airport and turn right onto westbound Drennan Road. Go a half-mile and turn right onto Powers Boulevard. Continue about 2 miles to US 24/Fountain Boulevard and turn left. Follow westbound US 24 for 4 1/2 miles to its merger with Interstate 25. Continue on I-25/US 24 about 2 miles to US 24/Cimarron Street and turn left at end of exit ramp. Go approximately 65 miles to CO-9 and turn right. Continue about 39 miles to Breckenridge, where CO-9 becomes Main Street. Resort entrance is on the left.
